

Reciprocal Real Estate Licenses

Massachusetts Real Estate Reciprocal Licenses

If you are resident of the State of Rhode Island and hold a real estate sales or broker's license, you are eligible to apply for a Massachusetts Salesmen or Broker's license.

- Obtain a ***certified record of your license history indicating that you have an active license in good standing*** from the R.I. Department of Business Regulation, Real Estate Division, by contacting them at (401) 462-9546.
- Send this record along with a cover letter requesting an application to: Board of Real Estate, 239 Causeway Street, Boston, MA 02114
- Your cover letter should contain your name, mailing address, date of birth, and a non-refundable application fee of \$45 for brokers or \$27 for salesmen. Checks are made payable to: Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Connecticut Real Estate Reciprocal Licenses

If you are resident of the State of Rhode Island and hold a real estate sales or broker's license, you are eligible to apply for a Connecticut Salesperson's or Broker's license.

- Obtain a ***certified record of your license history indicating that you have an active license in good standing*** from the R.I. Department of Business Regulation, Real Estate Division, by contacting them at (401) 462-9546.
- Complete the attached [application](#) and return it to: State of Connecticut, Department of Consumer Protection, License Services Division, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, CT 06106. If you are

applying as a salesperson, you must be sponsored by a broker in Rhode Island that has an active Connecticut license.

- The application fees are \$60 for brokers and \$40 for salespersons. Checks should be made payable to: Treasurer, State of Connecticut.

Rhode Island Real Estate Reciprocal Licenses

If you are a resident of Connecticut or Massachusetts and hold a real estate sales or broker's license in those states, you are eligible to apply for a RI reciprocal real estate license, without examination, provided you have been licensed by examination and the license is active and in good standing.
